5.4 Details of student support mechanism for coaching for competitive examinations (If any)

The College has started conducting classes for Examination for Entry Level Services for the SC/ST/OBC (Non-creamy layer) and Minority students under UGC XI plan Merged Scheme. Various workshops and training programmes by experts were organized for these students. The experts for the coaching are invited from outside for various competitive examinations. College faculty members provide guidance to the students.

6.2 Does the Institution has a management Information System

The College has a well-established on-line reporting system for MIS systems of the Office of the Director (Higher Education), Higher Education Department of the Government and the UGC. The College completes the reporting of all these Higher Educational Bodies in time. The College is covered under the *esevarthpranali* for the salary payment of its employees. It is using Uni-Suit Accounting System of the SNDT Women's University for recording, budgeting as well as for reporting.

6.3 Quality improvement strategies adopted by the institution for each of the following:

6.3.1 Curriculum Development

- All the courses are designed by Boards of Studies appointed by the university. Two faculties are the board members and one faculty is a chairperson (Accountancy) of the Boards of Studies. Besides this three faculties are the invitee members of the Boards of Studies. They contribute to the designing of the syllabus and also communicate the feedback from stakeholders to the Board.
- Teaching staff members are also invited as resource persons and participants for the Content Development Workshops organised by the various colleges affiliated to the university.
- The college conducts Content Analysis workshops for faculty from different departments of the affiliated colleges to enable discussion and feedback on the syllabus. Teaching strategies are discussed and material is designed to facilitate teaching and learning.
- Data from the feedback forms given to student is discussed by faculty and strategies for teaching and learning are modified as per the requirements.
- Inputs from teachers and academic experts who conduct the workshops are communicated to the Boards of Studies.

6.3.2 Teaching and Learning

- The College encourages the teaching faculty members to constantly upgrade their knowledge. It also tries to provide the students with all possible learning facilities. The teaching staff members as well as the students are encouraged to use innovative and interactive teaching-learning methods.
- In order to facilitate the teachers to use technology, computers with internet access are made available to various Departments, in addition to printers and common LCDs.
- E-resources available in the University library are also made use of by most of our teachers.
- The self-study by the students was encouraged by adopting innovative teaching methods such as study tours, study visits, Man-O-Teach, Gujari, Art exhibitions, projects, surveys, short films, and power point presentations.
- The teaching staff members are deputed for seminars and conferences organised by different colleges and Universities.

6.3.3 Examination and Evaluation

- University norms and rules of minimum attendance, internal assessment, and the final examination are followed at college level.
- The College strictly adheres to the policy of timely examination and assessment schedules.
- As per the policy of the SNDT Women's University, the semester examinations for the first year B. A., B. Com, BVA, B.Sc.IT, BMS as well as the first and second year examination of BVA are conducted by the College.
- Internal assignments, projects, Group Discussion, Presentation, etc are assigned throughout the year.
- Majority of the teaching staff members participate in the paper setting and assessment conducted by University.

6.3.4 Research and Development

- Teaching faculty members imbibe research spirit among students by assigning them projects related to curriculum.
- The teaching faculty members are also deputed by the College to attend the research-related seminars, workshops, and orientations. Teachers participating in such activities are sanctioned duty leave.
- Almost all teachers participate and present research papers at State, National and International level seminars and conferences.
- Two of our teaching staff members are the recognized guides for M. Phil. and Ph. D. programmes.
- Inter collegiate research paper presentation competition called as "Manthan" for students are arranged to inculcate research habit among students.
- Three faculties of our college have undertaken Minor research projects.
- Our college also has a formal research cell.

6.3.5 Library, ICT and physical infrastructure / instrumentation

- Central library of the SNDT Women's University is well equipped with the books, journals, periodicals, and audio-visual study material to cater for the needs of the teachers and the students.
- Being a conducted college of the University housed in the same campus the college shares a common pool of resources of the University.
- Efficient, helpful and user-friendly Library staff ensures ready access to the various Library facilities. For the search of books from the collection, seven computers have been installed exclusively for access of students and staff. All necessary bibliographic details of the complete collection (books, journals) are accessible through the OPAC (Online Public Access Catalogue) in-built in the Library software.
- There are 16 computers with internet connection in the library available for the students and staff.
- All computers are connected to dedicated internet connection of MTNL services. E-resources such as JSTOR, INFLIBNET, PROQUEST, Sage Online etc. are available.
- The University library is registered as the member of INFLIBNET 'N-LIST' project under which the Library provides free access to more than 50000 e-resources including variety of e-journals and e-books to all teaching Staff and students.
- Besides the university library, each department of the college has also developed a rich library of its own. Every year new books are bought as per the suggestion of the department.
- The College has two Computer Laboratories with internet facility and every student is given the computer training. It is the policy of the College to keep all the labs updated.
- The College has sufficient grounds in the Campus for out-door sports activities and NCC parades.

6.3.6 Human Resource Management

- The College endeavours to maintain a congenial environment with a view of allowing the academic and administrative staff members to perform their duties effectively and efficiently.
- Best possible use of available technology is done for timely and efficient communication with all the teaching and non-teaching staff members.
- Principal conducts meetings with the Heads of the departments to ensure efficient functioning

3. The Context

"A sound mind in a sound body" has been an age-old saying which connotes that physical exercise is an important or essential part of mental and psychological well-being. Besides engaging in sports for the sake of fitness, sports can also be chosen as a career. And if one chooses it at college days, it helps the person grow as a successful sportsperson in later years. In this context, we are committed to give our students to develop themselves as the world-class sportspersons in making.

In India, some parents are still disoriented and indifferent about encouraging their daughters for higher education. Girls' education is rarely supported till research degrees. In this context, sports can provide students an opportunity to realize their dreams. A meritorious student in sports does not need higher degrees to become financially independent.

A recent study using state-level data concluded that an increase in female sports participation leads to an increase in women's labor force participation down the road and greater female participation in previously male-dominated occupations, particularly high-skill, high-wage ones In addition, more than four out of five executive businesswomen played sports growing up, and the vast majority reported that the lessons they learned on the playing field contributed to their success in business. Female and minority athletes are more likely to aspire to hold leadership positions later in life than their peers who are not athletes. Young women who play sports have a higher level of self-esteem, a lower Incidences of depression and a more positive body image.

4. The Practice
